***NEW MEMBER:*** Please welcome Treg White, who as full time military was not subject to the waiting list. Other than that excepted class, membership remains closed. The waiting list has over 60 names at this time, and most likely not everyone on the list will be presented with the opportunity to join up next year, unless our top max for membership is increased.

***NOVEMBER BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING:*** This will be held at the clubhouse at 6:30 PM on Monday Nov 9, and any interested person may attend.

***ACTION PISTOL PROGRAM:*** Finished up for the year, 2010 schedule is pending at this time.

***SHOTGUN PROGRAM:*** They will change over to Winter schedule beginning with the time change on November 1<sup>st</sup> (remember to set your clocks back an hour). Skeet will shoot the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Sundays 1 PM – 4 PM and every Tuesday and Thursday from 3 PM – 5 PM. 5-Stand will cease until Daylight Savings Time resumes next spring, and Trap will only be available as shooters for this discipline show up and want to shoot. All scheduled shoots and events will be “weather permitting” and subject to cancel due to rain, show or unsafe conditions like lightning or hail. They do have work available for new member’s work commitments.

***SMALLBORE RIFLE SILHOUETTE:*** Their 2010 schedule is pending, and will be posted here and on the web site when it is finished up. They are also planning on some CMP-style Sporter Rimfire matches next year, although this is very preliminary at this time. Generally you would fire at 25 and 50-yards at a paper target with very generous scoring rings, using most any common 22-rifle with or without scope. ***HIGH POWER RIFLE PROGRAM:*** Because of bad weather at the Oct 10 match, the annual "USMC Toys for Tots" benefit match, will be held as a 100-yard reduced range match in conjunction with the Annual High Power Picnic. Cost of this match is \$25, or \$5 and donation of a toy of good quality. Lunch will be more-or-less included, but participants are requested to bring a covered dish. Practice nights are over for this season and will resume next March, but the annual Veterans Day team match will be fired on November 14, as a Hearst Doubles format at 200, 300 & 600 yards. The high power committee has work available for new members.

***TACTICAL CARBINE:*** The High Power crew will also hold a special Tactical Carbine match on Sunday November 1 (remember the time change), registration starts at 7:30 and closes at 8:15 Sharp! This will be open to any semi-automatic military-style carbine or lever-action rifle with barrel not to exceed 20". It will start with a non-firing target identification exercise, then followed by a variety of scenarios requiring fast and accurate rifle fire out to 300-yards, most will be much less. Magazine changes or reloads will be required, additional time granted to rifles with non-detachable magazines. No alibis or sighting shots, know your zeros and bring a rifle that runs 100%! Shooting jackets or use of slings as other than a carrying strap are prohibited. Expect to fire approximately 50-rounds and bring at least two magazines. Targets may be stationary or moving and may be considered to be non-traditional. Sights may be iron, "red-dot" or optical up to 3x. In addition, this will be a two-gun match requiring a shotgun of at least 20-gauge and capable of firing at least 3 rounds without reloading. A tactical reload will be required. Bring at least 20-rounds of shotgun ammunition, no slugs, shot only! Transitions from carbine to shotgun will not be required. Contact Harold Mauck for more information at 620-662-7060. They will be finished up by 1:00 PM to clear the range for Shotgun Program, or possibly move to the north side.

***DMR TACTICAL RIFLE MATCH:*** The High Power Rifle crew will also hold a "designated marksman" rifle match on Saturday October 17, and you may contact Greg Krebaum at 620-662-7515 for more information about course of fire. Generally this will consist of a variety of slow and rapid-fire shooting from 25 to 600-yards in the positions

of standing, sitting or prone. Approximately 60-80 rounds will be necessary. Tactical reload may be required. Dress for the weather conditions. Shooting jackets and muzzle breaks not permitted, scope sights highly recommended. Targets are stationary and moving, fired and scored on IPSC targets. We will shoot at least two relays and score in the pits. Contact Greg Krebaum for more information on Precision Rifle at 620-662-7515.

***PRECISION RIFLE MATCH:*** The High Power Rifle crew will also hold a precision rifle match on Sunday November 8, and you may contact Greg Krebaum at 620-662-7515 for more information about course of fire. Generally this will consist of a variety of slow-fire shooting from 300 to 600-yards in the positions of standing, sitting or prone. Approximately 60-80 rounds will be necessary. Single shot rifles permitted. Tactical reload will NOT be required. Dress for the weather conditions. Shooting jackets and muzzle breaks not permitted, scope sights highly recommended. Slings, shooting sticks and bipods permitted. Targets are stationary and moving, fired and scored on IPSC targets. We will shoot at least two relays and score in the pits. ***PARTING SHOT:*** From Star Parker, American author, referencing an issue of Science Magazine from the 1960's: "A simple problem is put forth: A common grazing field is available to a community of herders. Everyone brings their cows there. Because there is no clear ownership, the only incentive each herder has is to bring all his cows to graze and consume as much as possible.

"With everyone doing it, and no one having any incentive to consider the implications of their behavior beyond consuming as much as possible, the final result is obvious. The field is destroyed.

"Only where there is ownership and private property do individuals working in their own self-interest also make everyone else better off. When it's yours and you have responsibility for it, you think about tomorrow and how to make best use of resources.

"Today's equivalent of the common field is what we call the public sector – government. And our grazers are politicians and interest groups."
